Representing Thompson were Acting Chairperson of the TSCRC Molly Stapleton, Chairperson of the ad hoc committee Barb Henderson, members at large Cheryl Turriff, Lydia Penner and Elder Jack Robinson, and Coordinator Penny Byer.

The Thompson contingent reiterated the need for preventive medical foot care, citing research done in 2022. Lydia Penner and Elder Robinson spoke about their experiences. In addition, a video interview with Cliff Duchesne was shown. Cliff supported the advocacy with a letter in 2022. Shortly before his passing, he agreed to be videotaped to talk about his experiences since the letter was written.
