Whether it's a music festival or shopping, businesses or events need to follow the practices outlined in Manitoba's Accessible Customer Service Standard.

Under the Standard all Manitoba organizations with at least one employee must have policies and procedures that help achieve respectful, barrier-free customer service. This includes:

- meet communication needs of customers, clients or members
- allow assistive devices, such as wheelchairs, walkers and oxygen tanks

The free **bike rides** provided to seniors and those with disabilities are once again in service. Businesses must also train their staff on Accessible Customer Service. Large employers with 50 employees or more must document (in print) their customer service policy and notify their customers that this policy is available in accessible formats on request.
