Seniors Centre Without Walls

Learn the difference between hyper and hypo thyroid

One in 10 Canadians is affected by thyroid disease. Many go undiagnosed, according to a program on Seniors Centre Without Walls.

Hypothyroidism (Hashimoto's Disease) occurs when your thyroid produces too little thyroid hormone. Symptoms include fatigue, brain fog, hair loss and several other symptoms. It is a simple treatment — one pill a day — but will be for life.

Hyperthyroidism (Grave's Disease) is the overproduction of the thyroid hormone. Symptoms include tremors, sweating, anxiety and several other effects. Radioactive iodine and/or surgery will likely be required. More than 80% of patients who receive treatment will become hypothyroid.
